Purpose

This presentation provides an overview of the closed DCPS facilities, their current uses, and describes the method with which they were “disposed” for other uses.

Data Sources

Data presented within this Presentation was gathered from four sources:

1. The Department of General Services
2. The District of Columbia Public Schools
3. The DC Public Charter School Board
4. The Office of the State Superintendent of Education

Definitions

The following categories describe the entities with programmatic control over the site:

- **DC Public Schools (DCPS)** - The site is either in use by DCPS or will be used for a future DCPS program based on their operational needs.
- **Department of General Services (DGS)** - The facility underwent the Request for Offers (RFO) process, no award was made, and the site is awaiting determination for future use.
- **Deputy Mayor for Education (DME)** - The RFO process is active and/or underway; the RFO process applies to former DCPS buildings that have been “excessed”.
- **Public Charter School (PCS)** - A public charter school owns or leases a former DCPS building.
- **Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development (DMPED)** - The facility underwent the RFO process, no award was made, and the building has been identified for a development purpose.
- **University of the District of Columbia (UDC)** - Building awarded to UDC for exclusive use through Council legislation.
- **Other District Agency** - The site is in use by a District government agency other than DCPS.

When DCPS Facilities Closed

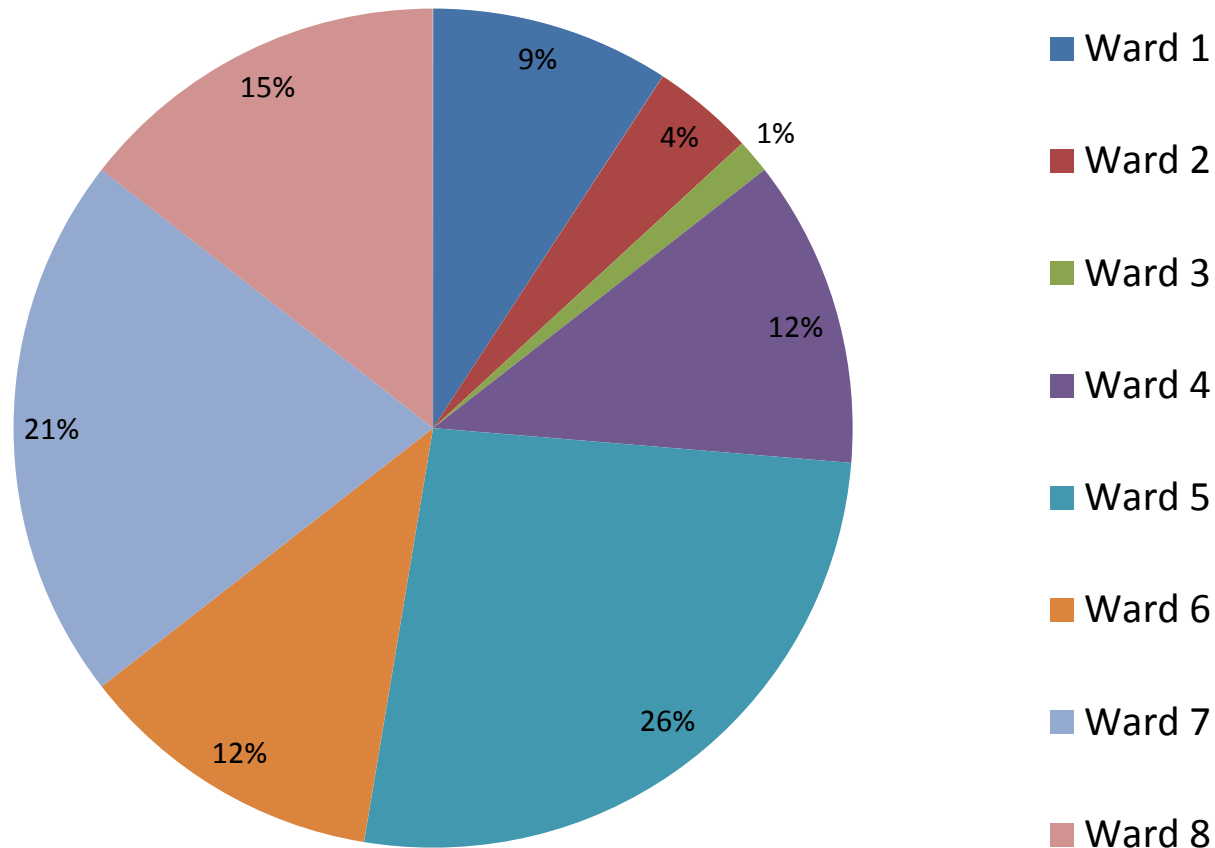
Most of the closed DCPS facilities (72%) occurred in 2008 or earlier.

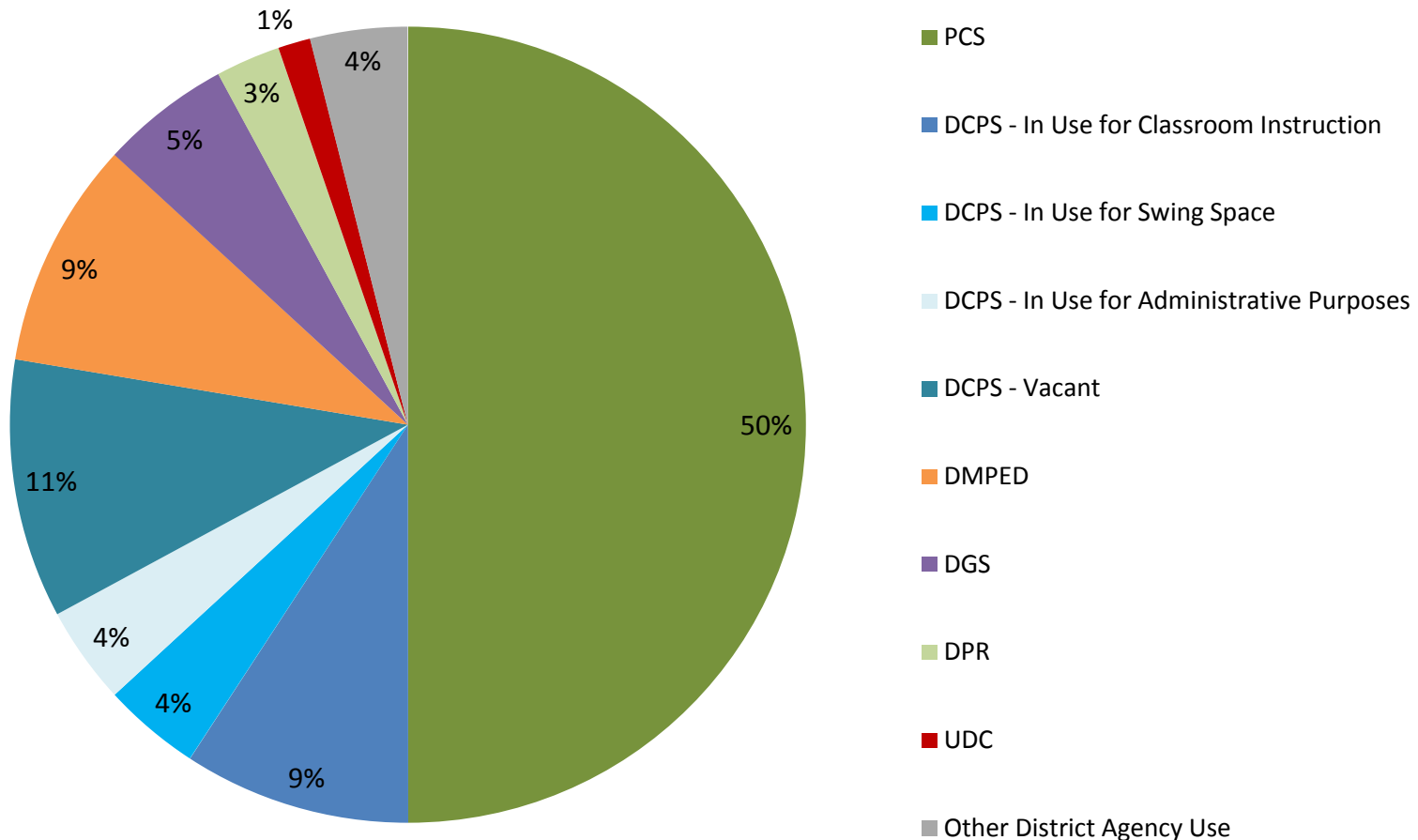
Where DCPS Facilities Closed

A total of 76 buildings have closed to date. Almost half of the closed DCPS buildings are located in Ward 5 and Ward 7.

As of SY16-17, most closed DCPS buildings are in use by public charter schools.

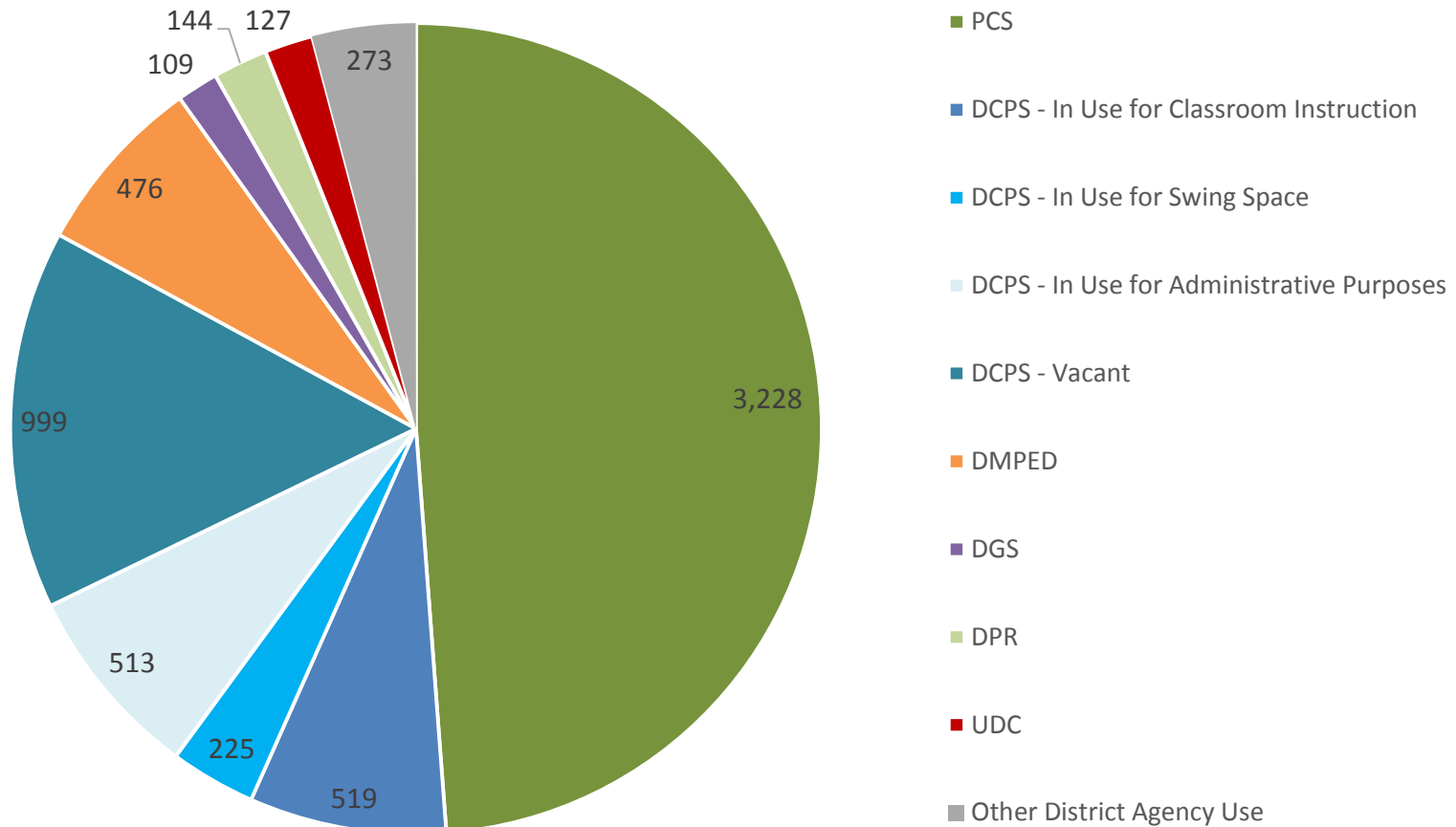

How is DCPS using 21 formerly closed DCPS facilities?

DCPS Facility Inventory in SY2016-17

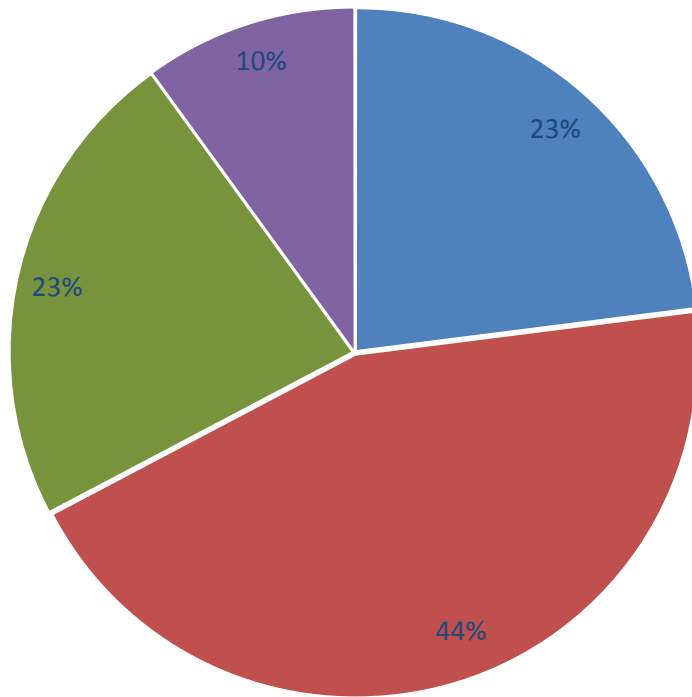
- DCPS has 112¹ active facilities that support 48,777 students from PK3 through STAY programs for young adults².
- Over the last twenty years, DCPS has closed 41% of previously existing school buildings (76 out of 182).
- Of the 21 closed facilities that remain in the DCPS portfolio as of SY2016-17:
 - 7 have reopened as new programs;
 - 3 are used as swing space;
 - 3 are used for administrative purposes; and,
 - 8 are vacant.

- Over 47% (31 out of 66) of all public charter LEAs are currently in a former DCPS building.
